- From the effective use of the club attendance tracker and teacher assessment, we have identified a group of children who would benefit from an opportunity to take part in sporting activities and develop a lifelong love of sport and physical activity.
- Teacher assessment has identified children who have shown the potential to excel within a range of different sports, these children have been actively encouraged to take part in inter-school competitions and, in many cases, have been signposted to local specialised community clubs.

- Increase opportunities for children to compete and celebrate sporting achievements.
