Why is the study of Health and Social Care important?

Health and Social Care is a course that introduces you to the specialist knowledge and skills needed to work in a variety of care settings. Underpinning the qualification, is a focus on core values and communicating with individuals so as to maintain their dignity and a sense of being valued. The content covered within this course is not only relevant to everyday life, but also gives you the chance to fully explore and understand the requirements and skills needed to work in a variety of different health, social care and early years settings.

What skills will the study of BTEC Health and Social Care teach you?

The exam board and specification we follow is OCR Level 1/2 Cambridge Nationals in Health and Social Care. Throughout the study of this qualification, you will complete a wide variety of units that include both a practical assessment as well as written coursework. The compulsory units allow you to really submerge yourself into a health, social care and early years mindset, enabling them to think like care practitioners as well as act like them. This subject broadens horizons for you and gives a real life insight into what working in this type of profession really involves.

What will you know and understand from your study of BTEC Health and Social Care?

Our Cambridge National in Health and Social Care will encourage students to:

- Understand and apply the fundamental principles and concepts of the rights of individuals, person centred values, effective communication and how to protect individuals in health and social care settings.
- Develop learning and practical skills that can be applied to real-life contexts and work situations.
- Think creatively, innovatively, analytically, logically and critically.
- Develop independence and confidence in using skills that would be relevant to the health and social care sector and more widely.

How can you deepen your understanding of Health and Social Care?

Throughout the study of this subject, you will have the chance to attend scheduled enrichment sessions within the academic year that will be tailored to your needs. Whether that be coursework intervention or preparation and revision for your exam.

How are you assessed in BTEC Health and Social Care?

There are 6 assessment points each year that we term Praising Stars©.

We assess how students at their current stage of study are on track to reach their end of stage targets which are formulated on aspirational expectation from their KS2 starting points.

We make an informed prediction from our holistic assessments based on our subject mapping of expectation across the Health and Social Care curriculum. Students are assessed through x2 coursework modules that include elements of practical work as well as a written one exam paper which is compulsory through the exam board. Students will take the exam in June of Year 11.

R034: Creative and therapeutic activities This unit is assessed by a set assignment. In this unit you will research



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therapies and learn about how they can benefit people. You will also learn about the benefits of creative activities and you will plan and deliver a creative activity to a group or individual.

- o Topic Area 2 Creative activities and their benefits
- o Topic Area 3 Plan a creative activity for individuals or groups in a health or social care setting
- o Topic Area 4 Deliver a creative activity and evaluate your own performance
